Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to formally object to the planning application (Reference: 25/001/CBP) submitted by Riley Mixed Concrete Limited to operate a blending, packing, loading, unloading, and bulk cement process at Dunnockshaw Farm, Burnley Road, Burnley, BB11 5PP.

As a resident living in very close proximity to the proposed site, I am seriously concerned about the significant impact this development is already having on my health, wellbeing, and property.

I am currently five months pregnant, and the increased pollution and heavy vehicle traffic is deeply worrying for both my health and that of my unborn child. The level of dust, debris, and airborne particles generated by the site's operations is unacceptable and presents a clear risk to respiratory health, especially for vulnerable individuals.

In addition to the health concerns, the disruption caused by heavy goods vehicles (HGVs) is extremely distressing. These lorries arrive and depart at all hours of the day, creating considerable noise, vibrations, and disturbances. This not only affects my ability to rest but also contributes to heightened stress levels again, particularly dangerous during pregnancy.

The impact on my property has also been severe. My car, which is worth approximately £35,000, is frequently covered in dirt and cement residue from the site. My windows and the exterior of my home are also constantly filthy, despite regular cleaning. The ongoing grime and industrial fallout make it feel as though I am living in an industrial zone rather than a residential neighbourhood.

This development is clearly incompatible with the character of the local area and is already causing an unacceptable level of disruption to residents.

I strongly urge the council to reject this permit application in the interest of public health, residential amenity, and community wellbeing.

Please record this letter as a formal objection and ensure it is included on the public register. I would appreciate confirmation that this representation has been received and registered.
